2. Comment on Gandhi's idea of Hindustani as a link language.

4. Discuss the character of Bela in *Raag Darbari*.
5. Comment on the title and structure of Part I of Rushdie's *The Moor's Last Sigh*.
6. Discuss the significance of the cartoon characters painted by Vasco Miranda in *The Moor's Last Sigh*
7. Discuss Kolatkar as a poet of the city.
8. Discuss how Kolatkar's poetry defamiliarizes reality.

## ENG IV (Core): Fiction

1. Meritocracy in Jane Austen's *Persuasion*.
2. Familial structures in Jane Austen's *Persuasion*.
3. Comment on Esther Summerson's narrative in Charles Dicken's *Bleak House*.
4. Reflect upon the complexities of society and judiciary in Charles Dicken's *Bleak House*.
5. Bombay/Mumbai in Rohinton Mistry's *Family Matters*
6. Critically comment on the dialogic form of Rohinton Mistry's *Family Matters*.
7. Technology and surveillance in Milan Kundera's *The Unbearable Lightness of Being*.
8. The Heterodiegetic narrator in Milan Kundera's *The Unbearable Lightness of Being*.

## Submission Guidelines:

- The last date of submitting the assignment is 19 March, 2022 and is non-negotiable.
- Each student will submit an end-of-term paper on each course studied in the syllabus. Each paper will be written on a topic selected from the list of topics given for the particular course. The length of each paper submitted shall be between 750 to 1000 words, but shall never exceed 1000 words. The word-count does not include 'Work Cited' but it does include footnotes/endnotes.
- The essay must be properly formatted as per MLA 8<sup>th</sup> Edition. It must be double-spaced, in Times New Roman (or similar) font, size 12, with a 1-inch margin all around. Name of any individual faculty member must not be included in the essay. The file must be in PDF format (max size 10 MB).
- The internal assessment committee will follow the UGC guidelines for penalty in cases of a high 'similarity index' being obtained. Plagiarism being a serious academic offence, all students may note that it will be appropriately penalised.
- Similarity index certificate is not required on part of the students.
- Completely filled IA cover sheet must be included as the first page of the assignment.
- Handwritten essays will not be accepted.
