- The students may meet the mentors in person by appointment or correspond through email.
- They are required to submit a written assignment of 30 marks based on any of the topics provided by the department. However, the topic must pertain to the particular paper for which the assignment is being submitted.
- The written assignment is required to be 1000-1200 words excluding title page and including bibliography. Under no circumstances the assignment should exceed 1200 words and penalties for the same may be exercised if required.
- The essay must be properly formatted as per MLA 9th Edition. It must be double-spaced, in Times New Roman (or similar) font, size 12, with a 1-inch margin all around.
- The students are required to submit four written individual assignments separately for each paper to the respective mentors for that particular paper.
- The papers must be sent to the email ID of the respective mentors with cc to obe.ma@english.du.ac.in.
- The assignments must be the original work of the students. They are strongly advised against plagiarism.

Submission Guidelines (for college students):

- The last date of submitting the assignment is 7th December, 2023 and is non-negotiable.
- Each student will submit an end-of-term paper on each course studied in the syllabus.
- Each paper will be written on a topic selected from the list of topics given for the
 particular course. The written assignment is required to be 1000-1200 words excluding
 title page and including bibliography. Under no circumstances the assignment should
 exceed 1200 words and penalties for the same may be exercised if required.
- The essay must be properly formatted as per MLA 9th Edition. It must be double-spaced, in Times New Roman (or similar) font, size 12, with a 1-inch margin all around. Name of any individual faculty member must not be included in the essay.
- The file must be in PDF format (max size 10 MB).

- The assignments must be the original work of the students. They are strongly advised against plagiarism.
- Completely filled IA cover sheet must be included as the first page of the assignment.
- Handwritten essays will not be accepted.
- The papers have to be submitted to the following Google links:
