## THE CONFERENCE



The Conference seeks to explore Shakespeare's insight regarding Governance and Justice. The critical canon accrued around Shakespeare's works consistently talks about the political motifs in his works. His plays showcase a number of issues pertaining to administration, taxation, law and justice. While these on the one hand are read as an endorsement to the then prevailing Tudor Myth; on the other, are considered as sites suggesting potential subversive resentment against the authorities. Besides, Shakespeare's works sporadically deliberate not only on the various possibilities of human existence – from edenic to tyrannical, but also on the alternative forms of governance other than the prevailing monarchy. Likewise, on the issues pertaining to justice, one may find in Shakespeare's works a range of examples from vendetta to institutional and cosmic justice. The Conference invites faculty members and scholars to re-visit these issues from different critical perspectives.
