Rita Kothari is a Professor of English and the Head of the Department of English at Ashoka University, is a multilingual scholar and translator whose work spans different disciplines such as literature, cultural studies, anthropology, sociology and history. She is the author of several books, including: *Uneasy Translations: Self, Experience and Indian Literature* (Bloomsbury, 2022); *Memories and Movements: Borders and Communities in Banni, Kutch, Gujarat* (Orient Blackswan, 2013); *The Burden of Refuge: The Sindhi Hindus of Gujarat* (Orient Blackswan, 2019); *Translating India: The Cultural Politics of English* (Routledge UK, 2005; Cambridge University Press India, 2008). She has also co-edited several anthologies on language politics and translation, as well as Partition studies; she has translated extensively from Gujarati and Sindhi into English.

Prof. Kothari will be speaking on the journeys we make with language; how we dwell in them, abandon them, and modify ourselves linguistically to invent new forms of self.
